FIRST READING

Isaiah 45:1,4-6

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to
Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right
hand to subdue nations before him and
strip the loins of kings, to force
gateways before him that their gates
be closed no more: 'It is for the sake of
my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen
one, that I have called you by your
name, conferring a title though you do
