## RESPECT FOR THE HOLY EUCHARIST

On three or four occasions in the last few weeks, Sacred Consecrated Hosts have been found discarded in the Church – mostly upstairs on the left hand side as you face the altar. This is clearly a very serious and disturbing matter. You are reminded to observe the following: If you receive the Sacred Host on your hand, you are expected to consume it IMMEDIATELY within clear view of the priest, deacon or Extraordinary Minister from whom you have received it. Ministers have been asked to be particularly vigilant in this regard. If you have the care of children, please ensure that, if they have received the Eucharist they consume the host and have no opportunity to remove it from their mouth afterwards. Please also speak to your children about how important this is. Please also be conscious of anyone who appears not to understand properly what they are doing when they come forward for Holy Communion and speak to Mgr. Paul or one of the other ministers immediately. Thank you for your vigilance in this very important area and please say an extra prayer of thanksgiving and praise for the gift of the Holy Eucharist as a gesture of reparation for the offence that has been caused.
