## HOLY WEEK

***Please take the separate sheet  
available today which gives the  
times of all our Holy Week Services.***

The Holy Week mysteries, which  
are revelations from God, begin  
with the celebration of Palm  
Sunday and will culminate in a  
solemn liturgy of such gravity and  
importance that it will be offered  
for three days. The mysteries of  
Holy Week are not inventions of  
culture, but revelations from God.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday  
of Holy Week, anticipation will  
grow that mysteries about who  
Christ truly and really is will be  
revealed. On Thursday of Holy  
Week, the great liturgy of three  
days will begin with the revelation  
of the first mysteries, the gift and  
the meaning of the priesthood  
(Chrim Mass in the Cathedral) and  
of the Holy Eucharist (Evening  
Mass in the Parish).

Then on Friday of Holy Week, the  
great liturgy will continue with the  
revelation of the mystery and  
meaning of the cross.

Finally on Saturday, the faithful will  
keep quiet vigil and wait for the  
revelation of the radiance of the

Lord's resurrection, and then on  
Sunday, the Church will emerge  
from the cocoon of its lenten  
observances resplendent in the  
glory of the Christ, risen from  
the dead.
