400TH ANNIVERSARY

The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul (SSVP) was founded in Paris in 1833 by Frederic Ozanam, and is named after one of France's greatest saints, Saint Vincent de Paul. He was born in 1581, ordained in 1600 and in 1617 he formed the Congregation of the Mission, and other organisations, collectively called the "Vincentian Family". He died in 1660 and was canonised in 1737. This year is therefore the 400th anniversary of the Vincentian family and it is being celebrated at home and abroad with a range of events on the theme: "Welcome the Stranger". Our own SSVP Conference meets on a Monday evening at 7.30pm in the Meeting Room, where we discuss and arrange our current activities.

GOSPEL

Matthew 17:1-9

He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this the disciples fell on their faces overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

FIRST READING

Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

As I watched: Thrones were set in place and one of great age took his seat. His robe was white as snow, the hair of his head as pure as wool. His throne was a blaze of flames, its wheels were a burning fire. A stream of fire poured out, issuing from his presence. A thousand thousand waited on him, ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. A court was held and the books were opened. And I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence. On him was conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. His sovereignty is an eternal
